The yachts themselves provide a serious taste of luxury, with en-suite cabins, al fresco dining decks and gourmet meals cooked to order by your private chef (expect to have the most Instagrammable of holiday snaps).

As for the experience of taking to the water, one moment you could be mooring up in the Bay of Naples, the next you could be sitting on deck watching the sun set with a glass of your favourite wine. Not a bad way to spend a week...

Greece is the word

Greece has always been a firm favourite, but each year we tend to see a new island or strip of coast that people have got the hots for. For 2018, it's the islands of Santorini, Kefalonia and Zakynthos that have got people talking.

With a gorgeous colour scheme of blue and white, and views so unbelievable photos don't do them justice, Santorini is the perfect hotspot for a romantic break. Then there's Kefalonia. Often overlooked in favour of its northern neighbour, Corfu, Kefalonia's unspoilt landscape is attracting lovers of the outdoors, while its upmarket yet low-key towns are stealing the attention away from traditional glitz-and-glamour spots like St-Tropez.

Head south of Kefalonia and you have Zakynthos, an island that's shaken off its party reputation with the help of an influx of luxury hotels (and one of the most photogenic beaches in Greece).

Vintage stays

Some things are better a little vintage and that is definitely the case with Paradores – unique, historic hotels scattered across Spain. Stays at these characterful properties (we're talking the likes of medieval castles and Renaissance palaces) come as part of our exciting new itineraries, one taking you to the cultural cities of Andalucia, and the other to the rugged landscapes of northern Spain.

The Andalucia itinerary is an eight-day loop, taking in the Moorish palaces of Granada, Seville and Cordoba. You'll also stay in Parador de Ronda, which balances on the edge of a 300-foot gorge.

Head for the north and you'll be journeying through Rioja country, with stops at Olite, Argomaniz and Hondarribia.

More than just a pretty face

Looking for more than just a pretty coastline? You're not alone – destinations which team beach days with a slice of adventure are sky-rocketing for 2018. Sri Lanka is our pick, with lush jungle to explore, wildlife to spot and ancient temples to tour.

Four-day tours focus on the south, while our eight-day itinerary also includes visits to Sri Lanka's medieval capital city and the lofty fortress of Sigiriya. But which destination's for you? Maybe city, maybe beach – or maybe both. »





Riad Kniza

Cultural and colourful Marrakech

Why: Marrakech is steeped in history and culture, showcased throughout its vibrant bazaars, captivating monuments and terracotta-hued streets. There's a generous dose of new world in and around these fascinating areas, too. It doesn't have to be an all-or-nothing place – the chaotic hustle and bustle of the medina isn't far from the most peaceful of hotels, spas and gardens.

Not to be missed: We recommend heading for the hills one day. Towering over this gorgeous city are the snow-tipped Atlas Mountains, where you'll find grand valleys, quaint villages and to-die-for views. Stop for a spot of lunch with a view at Toubkal du Kasbah, where dining skips the traditional table-and-chair set up in favour of sofas, low tables and plenty of cushions.

Eat your heart out: La Maison Arabe. Try the lamb tagine with oranges, seasoned with saffron pistils. For real foodies, why not try your hand at one of the cooking workshops. The hotel's fully kitted out restaurant is the perfect stage for all cooking levels.

Where to get your hammam: Les Bains Spa in the Kasbah area. Relax around the pool, surrounded by high walls for privacy, before heading for a couples' massage.

Shopping: The medina is the shopping experience of a lifetime. The souks spill out north from Djemaa el-Fna square and sell everything from nourishing Argan oil and spices, to silver tea sets, rugs and lanterns. Don't be afraid to have some fun with it – the locals don't mind a bit of bartering.

Where to stay

Fairmont Royal Palm

Expect dreamy rooms, a peaceful feel and exquisite cuisine at the Fairmont Royal Palm. A 2,000-square-metre swimming pool is perfect for soaking up some winter sun, and there's a Clarins spa for relaxation after an afternoon in the medina.

Riad Kniza

Riad Kniza is Moroccan beauty at its best – beautiful, luxurious and tranquil. What puts this property on the map, however, is the owner. Haj Mohamed Bouskri is one of the most renowned antique dealers in Marrakech and one of the best professional guides, too (he's shown the city's sights to former US Presidents and A-list celebrities). We'd like to get him sitting around the dinner table one night!

Les Jardins de la Medina

The Les Jardins de la Medina is a traditional riad with a courtyard at its heart and a quiet pool surrounded by lush greenery. Late afternoons can be spent on the rooftop terrace, where you can enjoy views of the sunset and the Atlas Mountains.

Afternoon break: Nomad rooftop bar, located in the heart of the souks. Sip on a Moroccan mint tea and enjoy the views of terracotta roofs and colourful carpets hanging from the sides of buildings.

Top recommendation: If you're looking to get your teeth into local culture, stop for a bite to eat in the centre of the medina. If you can embrace the fight for your attention from each stall's owner, pull up a bench, join the locals and feast on succulent lamb kebabs and herby couscous.

Beachy and breezy Essaouira

Why: Seaside Essaouira, known as the windy city, attracts beach lovers and windsurfers from all over the globe. Essaouira takes on a pretty laid-back attitude to day to day life – quite a contrast to bustling Marrakech. Its old town is guarded by ancient walls; outside, you'll find a fishing harbour and sandy beach.

Not to be missed: At the heart of Essaouira is its lively, working harbour. Watch as fishermen sort their catch of the day for nearby restaurants and locals pick their favourite at the fish market.

Eat your heart out: La Table by Madada, located in the medina. This restaurant and lounge bar offers up live music, an impressive wine selection and some of the best seafood in Essaouira.

Where to get your hammam: Heure Bleue Palais – the spa's black marble walls and dim lighting provide the ideal environment for a relaxing hammam.

Afternoon break: Head to the Mega Loft, in the medina. Its chilled-out ambience and live music makes for the perfect laid-back afternoon.

Shopping: Essaouira's medina is bustling, but takes a more relaxed vibe. It's not restricted to the city's main square – stalls spill into the surrounding medieval streets. Here, you can haggle for spices, oranges, colourful dinner plates, and hand-woven rugs.

Top recommendation: The Argan tree is native to Morocco and its oil is used in hair and beauty treatments across the world. In Essaouira, there are lots of places where you can see how it's made (and pick up a bottle to take home). ■

Where to stay

Sofitel Essaouira Mogador Golf and Spa

The family-friendly Sofitel Essaouira Mogador has got laid-back break written all over it. Pick between one of the two pools to cool down, then pull up a pew at L'Atlantique restaurant with its ocean views and menu of local seafood.

Riad dar L'Oussia

This riad's location, just inside the town walls, makes it ideal for those looking for a traditional oasis that's still convenient for exploring. The design is warm (think terracottas and reds) and rooms are cosy, while the restaurant takes on a vault vibe, with a lovely fireplace.

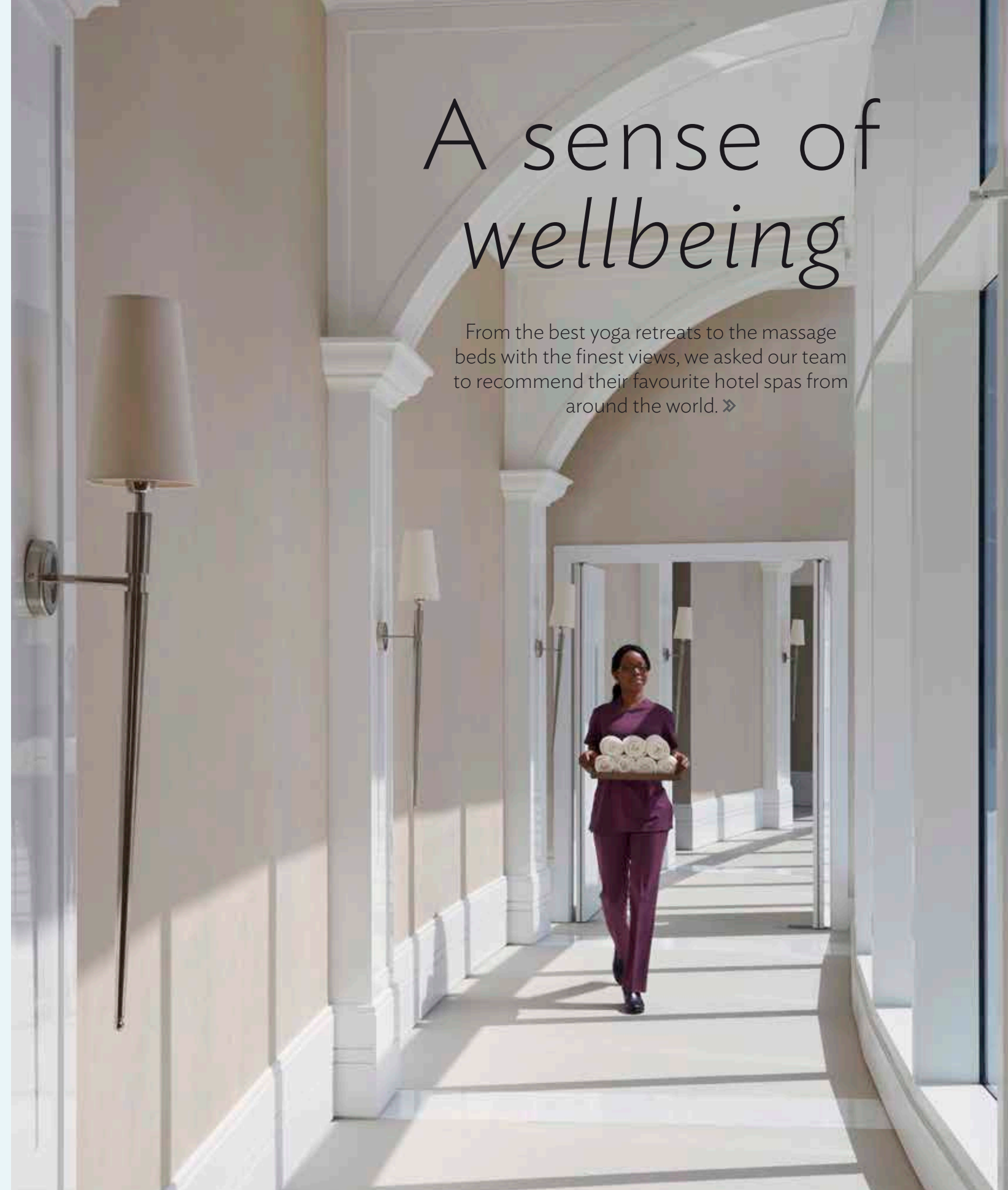
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A sense of wellbeing

From the best yoga retreats to the massage beds with the finest views, we asked our team to recommend their favourite hotel spas from around the world. »



Best for views:
Son Brull Hotel & Spa, Majorca

Recommended by Leanne Hall, Trusted Adviser

The Son Brull Hotel & Spa is nestled in the quiet countryside of Pollensa in northern Majorca, so it comes with wraparound views of wooded hills and tree-dotted fields. Opt to have your massage al fresco (there's a duo of outdoor massage pavilions) and you'll be able to take in the vistas while you relax.

The spa's ethos is all about keeping things natural, so the product range steers clear of artificial preservatives, synthetic perfumes and parabens, instead looking to native Majorcan ingredients.

Also try...

Jumeirah Port Soller's spa is a favourite among the team for its beautiful views over Majorca's Sierra de Tramuntana, while Alila Jabal Akhdar in Oman was picked out for the mountain-side massage arbour. And Casale Panayiotis in Cyprus gets Trusted Adviser Helen's vote, thanks to its fabulous massage-jet pool overlooking the Troodos Mountains.

Best for treatments:

Waldorf Astoria Dubai Palm Jumeirah, Dubai

Recommended by Lewis Parker, Trusted Adviser

Lewis picked out the Waldorf Astoria Dubai Palm Jumeirah for its 3,200-square-metre spa, named Best Luxury Destination Spa in the UAE at the 2017 World Luxury Spa Awards.

It offers treatments from all over the world – think Hungarian mud facials, Brazilian rosewood body polishes and Japanese Shiatsu massages – but Lewis' recommendation is the decadent 'Shimmering Dubai Nights' ritual, which includes a body scrub with flakes of real gold.

Also try...

Another of Lewis' recommendations is Jumeirah Zabeel Saray (also in Dubai), where staff tailor-make treatments for each client, while Trusted Adviser Karen loves the traditional Maldivian treatments on offer at Kurumba, which draw on 'dhivehi-beys' – traditional herbal medicine.

Best for yoga:
Four Seasons Sayan, Bali

Recommended by Helen Howard, Product Manager

Whether you're a beginner or you've been practising yoga for years, you'll find something to suit here. The yoga bale is cocooned among jungle greenery, with soul-soothing views over the Ayung River valley.

Complimentary classes include beginner stretches, sunrise sessions and laughter yoga. For a little extra, you could try AntiGravity®, hot stone and yin yoga. And if you happen to be staying during a full moon, you can carry out 'moon salutations' under the stars on the riverside terrace.

Also try...

Trusted Adviser Louise singled out Gran Hotel Atlantis Bahia Real in Fuerteventura for its scenic classes on the overwater sun deck. If you fancy doing your sun salutations in seclusion, try Baros Maldives, where you can opt for a sunrise session on a deserted sandbank.

Puente Romano Beach Resort & Spa, Marbella

The sleek Six Senses spa here recently launched a new wellness concept, with personalised programmes (based on stress levels, circulation and metabolism) and treatments using local ingredients (like extra-virgin olive oil, mountain herbs and sea salt).

The detox massages, wraps and scrubs are brilliant, and wellness experts are on hand to provide help and advice on exercise and nutrition.

Also try...

Trusted Adviser Natasha recommends the award-winning spa at Blue & Green Vilalara Thalassa Resort on the Algarve, which offers weight loss, wellness and thalassotherapy packages. St Lucia's The BodyHoliday was also praised by the team for its innovative wellbeing programme (and complimentary daily spa treatments).

Best for something a little different:
Lopesan Costa Meloneras, Gran Canaria

Recommended by Lindsay Barnes, Trusted Adviser

The huge spa here takes its cue from Gran Canaria's volcanic nature, featuring a lava cave (with floatation pool) and a relaxation area with a lava column as a striking centrepiece.

Follow the spa circuit and you'll experience a cold-water reflexology pool, tropical rain showers, a 35°C lagoon, an ice cave, a 'cosy' wall (great for backache) and much more. Not sure where to start? Lindsay recommends the Himalayan salt cave.

Also try...

Sugar Beach, A Viceroy Resort in St Lucia is a favourite of James, our Head of Sales and Customer Experience – treatment rooms are housed in huts suspended in the treetops. Keemala in Phuket is another good pick, with its philosophy of traditional Thai healing rituals and holistic therapies, and use of cruelty-free products. ■

4. Local tavernas

Who says all-inclusive dining ties you to the hotel? The folks at the Ikos Dassia want you to get a taste of real Corfu, so they’ve created a Dine Out concept that pulls cherry-picked local tavernas into your all-inclusive dining package.

5. Beachfront restaurants

When it comes to vistas, the Ikos Dassia doesn’t mess around. The Kerkyra and Ouzo restaurants stretch out on the sandy beach, so you get wide-angle views of the Ionian Sea.

6. Well-stocked wine cellar

Coastline of dreams: Praslin

Praslin comes with a large side order of beaches, arguably some of the best in the Seychelles – the ocean is impossibly blue, and the sands flour-white. Praslin isn't just a pretty face, however. Its centre is covered by the Praslin National Park, home to the black parrot, groves of coco de mer palm trees, tropical plants and footpaths. The Valle de Mai part of the park is on UNESCO's books – the best way to ensure you see its highlights is with a local guide.

Where to stay: Constance Lemuria

Constance Lemuria is poised perfectly in the north of the island, with a trio of beaches on the doorstep. Guests can enjoy everything from turtle spotting on the beach to romantic dinners for two on The Nest's secluded 'on the rocks' terrace. The U by Constance Spa is pretty special too, offering a range of personalised treatments and rituals.



In deep water: Silhouette Island

The waters off of Silhouette Island are well-stocked with marine life. There is a PADI dive centre available for those that are serious about scuba, although the snorkelling is fantastic too. It's not just the waters that are full of life, though – look up every now and then and you might spot the abundance of fruit bats that guard the island. ■

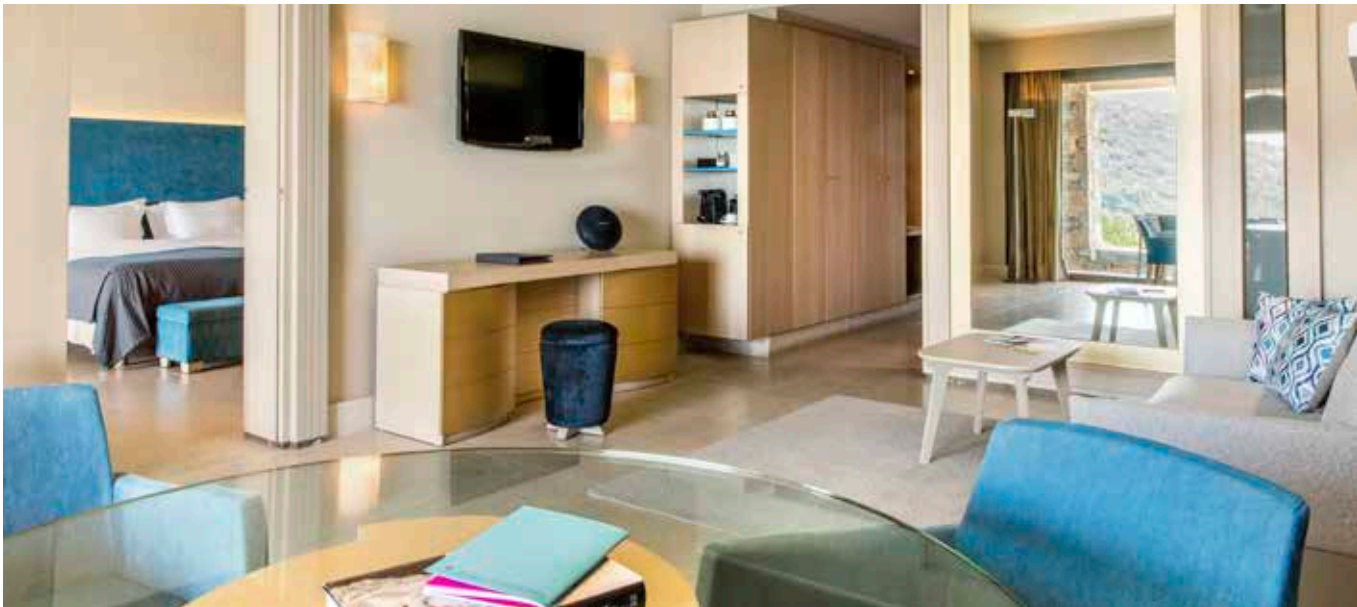

Croatia

If you're a *Game of Thrones* fan, you'll recognise Dubrovnik's World Heritage old town – the medieval streets, chunky town walls and baroque palaces play the part of King's Landing. 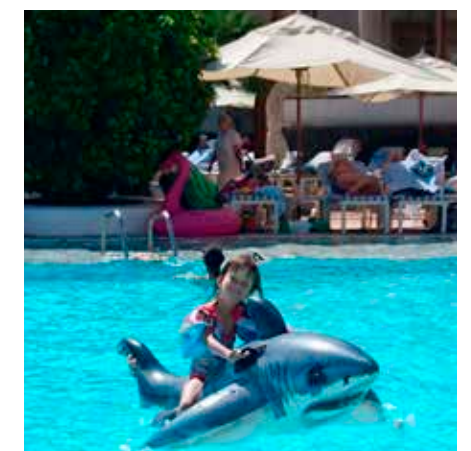
her room (which she still loves to play with back in England), as well as a bucket and spade for those all-important sandcastles.

We hope to grant more wishes to children like Lily in the future. In addition, we are encouraging our customers to donate £1 to this fantastic charity when they book their holiday with us. ■

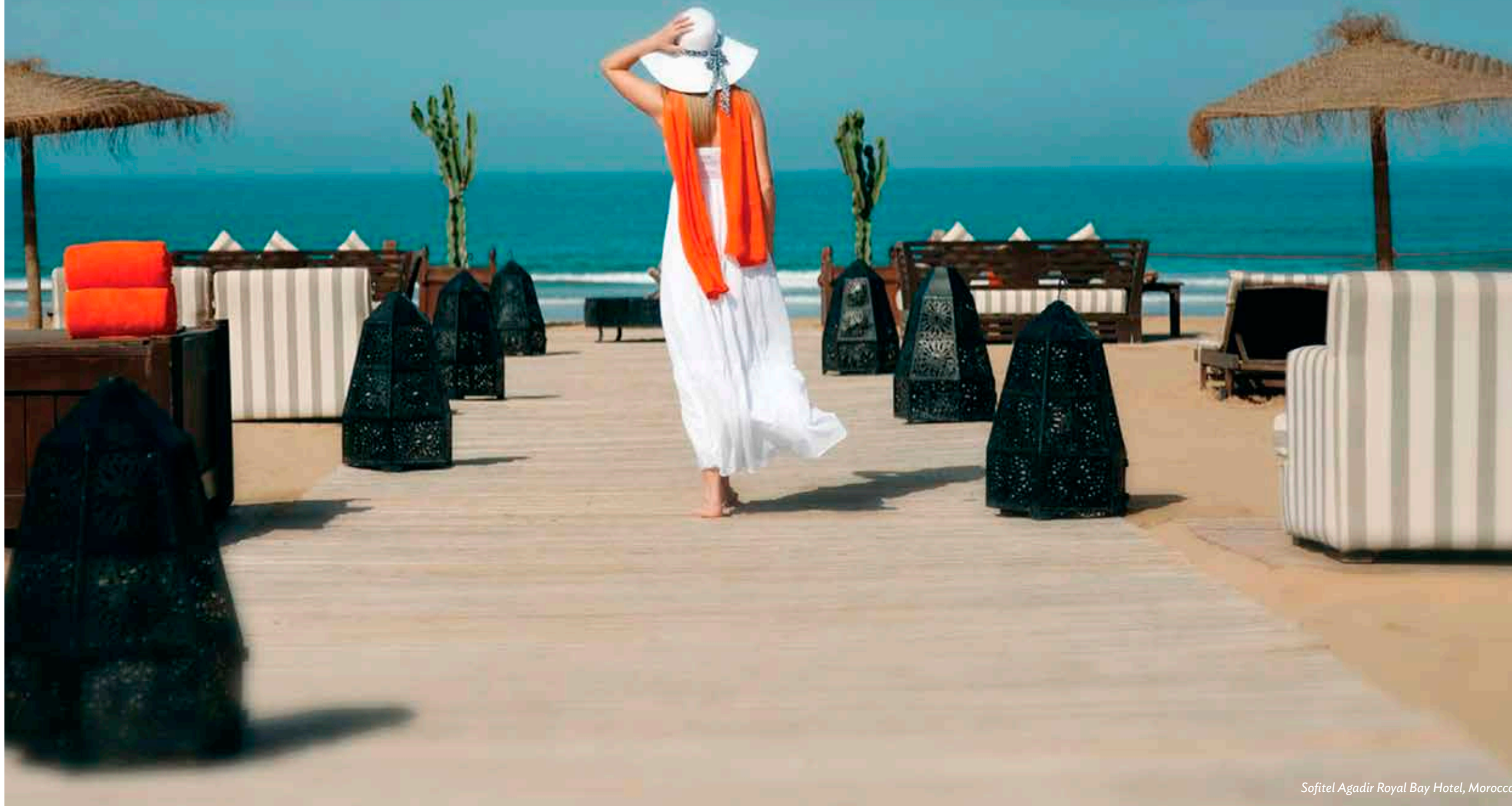
